The objective of this STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) research fellowship opportunity is to encourage talented individuals to pursue careers in the aerospace industry that support NASA's mission. The Virginia Space Grant Consortium provides graduate research fellowships in the amount of \$5,000 to supplement and enhance basic graduate support. Graduate Research Fellowships require that students participate in an active faculty-mentored research experience that aligns with the aerospace sector and meets NASA's mission. Awards are made annually and are renewable for one year for students making satisfactory academic and research progress.

This is a competitive fellowship program and awards are based on merit recognizing high academic achievement and promise. Underrepresented minority students, female students and students with disabilities are encouraged to apply.

Sponsor:

The Virginia Space Grant Consortium (VSGC) is a coalition of five Virginia Space Grant universities (College of William and Mary, Hampton University, Old Dominion University, University of Virginia, and Virginia Tech), the Virginia Community College System, NASA, state educational agencies, and other organizations representing diverse aerospace education and research interests.



Eligibility:

- Must be a U.S. citizen
- Must be enrolled as a full-time graduate student at one of the Virginia Space Grant Consortium member institutions
- May apply prior to entering or anytime during your graduate program
- Must be in a program of study demonstrating an interest in aerospace or supporting NASA's mission
- Must have a grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
